
## CERTIFICATE

ORDINANCE NO. 22-03-02

AN AMENDMENT TO Ordinance NO. 2000-08  
A PARKING BAN ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BUCKNER, FRANKLIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, THAT THE SECTION ENTITLED PENALTY BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

PENALTY

First offense: written warning to remedy the situation in 7 days

Second offense: a fine of \$75.00 and another 7 days to remedy the situation

Third offense: refusal of payment of fines will result in vehicle/vehicles being towed at owner's expense

Any violations will be subject to the laws of the state of Illinois (625 ILCS 5/11-1303) and the Village of buckner as stated.

- I. All other portions of Ordinance 2008-08 (A Parking Ban Ordinance) shall remain unaffected by this Ordinance.
- II. If any portion of this Ordinance shall be adjudged or declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Village Parking Ban Ordinance, and it is expressly declared that every other portion of the Village Parking Ban Ordinance not so adjudged or declared invalid is valid.
- III. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

## Ordinance No. 01-15

An Ordinance of the Village of Buckner, Illinois prohibiting parking on streets and in alleys of the Village for safety measures for emergency vehicles (fire trucks, ambulances, police cars, etc.) and obstruction of private driveways,

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Buckner, Franklin County, Illinois as follows:

For the purpose of this Ordinance the following terms and their meaning applies--

Streets are defined as any thoroughfare within the Village limits that are used for primary travel.

Alleys are defined as any Easement or Right of Way set aside for the Village of Buckner and it's agents.

Be it resolved that parking on streets or alleys is prohibited at any time, or for any reason, unless specific locations of streets has been indicated that parking is allowed.

Parking is allowed to the side of streets as long as all tires are off the pavement.

Parking is permitted on Main Street from Jenette Street to Burlison Street and on North Market Street from Main Street to Railroad Street.

---Parking from Railroad Street south for 100 feet will be temporary parking to allow Post Office customers parking. There shall be no parking in this designated area for more than 30 minutes.

Any violations will be subject to the law of the State of Illinois Department of Motor Vehicles and the Village of Buckner Ordinance as stated.
