**AN ORDINANCE DECLARING SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY AND  
AUTHORIZING SALE OF SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE VILLAGE  
BUCKNER, FRANKLIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS**, the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-2-1, provides that the corporate authorities of each municipality may pass all ordinances and make all rules and regulations proper or necessary, to carry into effect the powers granted to municipalities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Buckner (hereinafter the "Village"), is a non-home rule municipality incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois.

**WHEREAS**, the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, authorizes the Village to sell surplus personal property owned by the Village when the Corporate Authorities of the Village believe the property is no longer necessary, useful to, or in the best interests of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village currently owns multiple items of personal property, such as old vehicles previously used by the Village and the Village's Fire Department, and the Board of Trustees of the Village hereby desire and find it to be in the best interests of the Village and the Village's residents to declare the items of personal property as surplus, and to authorize the sale of said personal property.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Buckner, Franklin County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The preceding recitals in the upper part of this Ordinance are hereby restated and incorporated herein as Section 1 of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 2:** The following items of personal property presently owned by the Village are hereby declared to be surplus property of the Village of Buckner, Franklin County, Illinois, pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, as the personal property listed below is no longer necessary, useful to, or in the best interests of the Village, and the sale of the personal property listed below is hereby authorized by the Board of Trustees of the Village (as further described in Section 3 of this Ordinance):

1. 1993 Chevrolet Blazer (VIN 1GNDDT13W2P21338471)
2. 1952 Willy's Truck Utility ¼ ton 4x4 (Jeep) (Serial No. 38327)
3. 2002 Chevrolet Impala (VIN 2G1WF55K739202871)
4. 1993 Ford Ambulance (VIN IFDKE30M5PHB62678)
5. 1995 Pierce Pumper Engine (Serial No. E-8936-02)

**SECTION 3:** The personal property declared surplus herein, as described in Section 2 of this Ordinance (numbered 1-5), pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, is hereby authorized by the Village President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Buckner, Franklin County, Illinois, to be sold in the following manner:

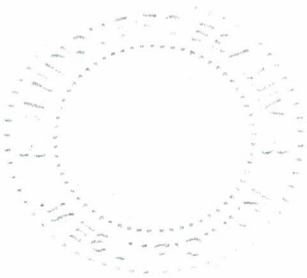
- A. The 1993 Chevrolet Blazer, 1952 Willy's Truck Utility, and 2002 Chevrolet Impala (as described in Section 2 of this Ordinance), are hereby authorized by the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Buckner, Franklin County, Illinois, to be sold at a future meeting of the Corporate Authorities, and notice shall be posted indicating the time, place, location, and minimum bid requirements for the purchase of the described property.
- B. The 1993 Ford Ambulance and 1995 Pierce Pump Engine (as described in Section 2 of this Ordinance) are hereby authorized by the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Buckner, Franklin County, Illinois, to be listed on the National Used Fire Apparatus Marketplace, and the Village President shall have the authority to execute any and all documents necessary in order to effectuate the listing, transfer, and sale of the personal property

**SECTION 4:** If any section, paragraph clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared to be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5:** All ordinances, resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

**SECTION 6:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval as provided by law.
